

2020 Rocky Mountain Section Meeting Provo, Utah | 4-5 May 2020

Dear GSA Members, 2020 RM Section Meeting Participants, Colleagues, and Friends,

We are writing to inform you that the Geological Society of America 72nd Annual Meeting of the Rocky Mountain Section will be canceled in Provo, Utah, 4–5 May due to the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). The health and safety of our members and event attendees are always our highest priorities, and with the growing number of travel restrictions for both academia and industry, the nation declaring a national emergency, and social distancing recommendations from the CDC and WHO, we have determined that we could not in good conscience continue with the meeting.

For over a year we have been planning on hosting this section meeting. The local planning committee and officers of the Rocky Mountain Section were excited to welcome you to the 72nd Annual Meeting of the Rocky Mountain Section of the Geological Society of America in Provo, Utah. The meeting was being hosted by the Department of Earth Sciences at Utah Valley University.

Sadly, the presence and spread of the novel coronavirus, both internationally and in the United States, makes it both impossible to hold a meeting that would even approximate the value of a place-based gathering, and irresponsible to encourage or expect participation, or even offer participation, when attendees could be exposed to a communicable disease and return home transmitting an illness to family and friends even before it manifests itself.

Although an in-person Rocky Mountain Meeting will not take place, we are exploring ways for the sessions and abstracts to still be presented virtually. As we work out those details with the Technical Program Chairs of the Rocky Mountain Section and our vendors, we will share that information with all the presenters.

GSA will be issuing full registration refunds for the meeting to all attendees, and attendees do not need to contact GSA for their refunds. Our Sales & Services Department will be in touch should they need anything in order to issue the refund. We also recommend that those who made hotel reservations, whether within the official block of the Marriott Provo or at other nearby hotels, cancel those reservations before there

are any penalties. In addition, many airlines (<u>United</u>, <u>Southwest</u>, and <u>Delta</u>) have announced that they are working with customers who have changing travel plans.

This decision is not an easy one for the local committee and leadership of the Rocky Mountain GSA Section and GSA HQ, but we feel it is the right one given the current situation. Thank you in advance for your understanding and patience as we work together for the health and safety of all our attendees.
